

VICTORIA

A thriving village nestled under Mt Shadwell, a volcanic cone. ated at the base of two magnificent volcanic craters and two volcanic cones. 18 LAKE PURRUMBETE Renowned for Chinook Salmon and Rainbow Trout fishing. 19 LAKE CORANGAMITE The largest permanent inland body of water in Australia, the shore line is more than 160kms. 20 RALPH ILLIDGE SANCTUARY Features magnificent flora of the area and many species of wildlife. Picnic and electric BBQ facilities. 21 DEAKIN UNIVERSITY - WARRNAMBOOL CAMPUS *Fishing *Motorcross *Go Kart Track *Rifle Range *Walking Track 23 CHILDERS COVE The coastline shows clearly the extent to which sea erosion has occurred over millions of years. The famous landmark 'Needle Rock' subsided into the cove in 1985. 24 PORT CAMPBELL NATIONAL PARK 32km stretch of scenic and historic coastline incorporating a magnificent series of sheer cliffs, deep caverns, great archways, grottos, island gorges, blowholes and spectacular off-shore rock stacks. Spectacular group of islands, viewing area. 26 PETERBOROUGH Small township situated on the mouth of the Curdies River. Great golf course. The path leads down to a beautiful rock pool about 8 metres above sea level. 28 LONDON BRIDGE One of the best known features of this part of the coastline has changed considerably over the past 20 years. The arch linking the 'bridge' to the mainland collapsing in January 1990. The Island Arch in the Loch Ard Gorge precinct collapsed forming two sea stacks in June 2009. THE ARCH Superb views of Two Mile Bay and Moonlight Head. 30 TWO MILE BAY A long walk over sand dunes to fishing beach, ideal for exploring reefs and rock pools at low tide. The iron clipper 'Loch Ard' foundered in 1878 claiming 49 lives. The 2 young survivors Eva Carmichael and Tom Pearce were washed into the gorge. Their story comes alive on the 9 metre high aquascreen at "Shipwrecked" screened nightly at Flagstaff Hill, Warrnambool. THE TWELVE APOSTLES World famous off-shore rock stacks - some so eroded that they can only be viewed at low tide Arguably the most photographed feature of the Australian coastline 33 PRINCETOWN Small settlement on the mouth of the Gellibrand River.

Named by Matthew Flinders in 1802 when he sighted the high cliffs in moonlight between squalls.

Ship anchor visible at low tide.
