LIGHTING OF THE SAILS

For the 10th Anniversary of Vivid Sydney, celebrated Australian artist Jonathan Zawada will create a site-specific artwork that transforms the Sydney Opera House sails into a series of kinetic digital sculptures.

Jonathan Zawada's concept for the installation explores metaphysical themes using imagery inspired by the Australian environment "I really wanted to take a big picture view of both what Vivid is about, but more importantly, how I feel about Australia as this kind of elemental. timeless place that is also completely new and full of energy."

Jonathan Zawada will create a series of digital sculptures and compositions that will distort and mutate in continuous motion. The artist will construct various scenes that evolve and dissolve as objects are introduced, removed or undergo metamorphosis. Within these scenes, everyday objects and natural specimens will appear as hyperreal representations and fantastical re-imaginings. Jonathan has also reflected on the canon of

Australian art and will appropriate the work of some famous and lesser known Australian artists in his artwork.

Jonathan Zawada's unique and highlyinfluential aesthetic style is characterised by his bold use of neon colour and striking geometric designs. The award-winning artist has exhibited extensively in Australia and overseas, including in Paris, London, Los Angeles, Beijing and Tokyo. He has

worked in collaboration with numerous Australian and international artists, including: Flume, The Presets, Mark Pritchard, Moses Sumney and Romance Was Born. Jonathan Zawada's approach to the Lighting of the Sails in 2018 encourages audiences of all ages and backgrounds to participate by identifying various recognisable Australian motifs across science, nature and culture.

Nature, the world, the universe, myths,

The route for the Light Walk stretches for more than 2kms from The Rocks to the Sydney Opera House and through the Royal Botanic Garden, Sydney. Vivid Sydney includes major projections and installations at the Sydney Opera House, Sydney Harbour Bridge, Museum of Contemporary Art Australia, Customs House and the ASN Co. heritage building in The Rocks.

There is so much to see that it's a good idea to plan your route and perhaps think about returning for a second and third visit. Start early - Lights On! is from 6pm every night. Come during the week for a more relaxed visit or join the crowds for a buzzing atmosphere on weekends. When you've finished the walk, dine at one of the many cafes, restaurants, food trucks and special hospitality venues nearby.

Please take public transport. It's cheaper and less hassle than driving and it delivers you easily to the start of the route.

VIEW FROM THE COSMOS

The installations on the western side of Circular Quay include two spectacular works that take you far above the earth and into the cosmos.

Projected onto the Southern Pylon of the Sydney Harbour Bridge (and best seen from across the water at East Circular Quay) is EORA - Dark Emu, a story told through Bangarra Dance Theatre's unique physical language. EORA - Dark Emu explores the legend of the Spirit Emu, who left the earth thousands of years ago to reside in the Milky Way.

At the Overseas Passenger Terminal, experience Earth, which melds detailed NASA imagery of the Earth's surface with a haunting cosmic soundscape. It will give you that same sense of awe and wonder experienced by astronauts as they viewed our planet from outer space over 50 years ago.



UNUSUAL BIRD LIFE

Perching close to each other in George Street, The Rocks, are two installations featuring unusual forms of bird life.

1000 Cranes is a canopy of 1000 hanging origami cranes that light up as people flock together under its shelter. The work is based around an ancient Japanese legend of hope, symbolised by the folding of 1000 origami cranes, known collectively as Senbazuru.

Nearby is **Peacock**, captured in that proud moment of dance when it displays its colourful plumage. It's an abstracted image made from an array of dynamic, colourchanging light tubes. Step inside the light tubes and become the 'Sydney Peacock'.









GREAT FOR YOUNG KIDS

First Fleet Park, next to the Museum of Contemporary Art Australia, is a top spot for children and families with many child-friendly light sculptures and installations designed to particularly delight young visitors.

The endearing inflatable light sculptures of Harmony Valley: Rainbows of Peace & Trees of Friendship generate friendly interaction and when a few people team up to link hands across its rainbow of light, sound and animation spring into action. Fugu may be modelled on a lethal pufferfish but it nevertheless captivates young audiences by expanding and contracting its spiky, rotating form, while glowing and pulsating with colours.

Nearby, the Garden of Sweeties sugar coats its invitation to learn more about renewable energy by offering playful interaction with a garden of sweets, lollipops and striped candy canes.

VIVID LIGHT WALK

DYNAMIC GEOMETRY

Geometric forms attract big crowds at Vivid Sydney as artists turn them from static objects to 3D canvases or decorative light patterns that dance, twirl, link up and turn upside down.

From its location in East Circular Quay, Visible Dynamics delivers its take on a child's stacking toy by connecting different geometric shapes, which light up and spin, inciting childlike wonder; meanwhile Fragmented is an illuminated steel cube that creates an infinite variety of coloured patterns as it gently spins before the crowd.

Nearby, the hollow cube of **The Space Arena** combines latest LED and 3D technology to create a new type of public performance and exhibition space.

Macquarie Place Park sits at the northern perimeter of the CBD, where a number of intriguing works are situated including **Chrysalis**, whose shell-like forms host resting butterflies. As viewers approach, they begin to flutter, ready to emerge as adults.







THE ROYAL BOTANIC GARDEN SYDNEY

Partying parrots, giant electric flowers and an illuminated forest of spiralling trees lead you into a world of fantasy during Vivid Sydney at the Royal Botanic Garden.







Pass through the QEII gates of the Garden and follow a pathway that weaves through an exciting nocturnal environment, revealing wonders created by artists and inspired by nature.

First, wander through the **Nautilus Forest** dodging strange spiral-like creations that might be trees, but could just as easily be corals or some curious form of animal life. This forest feels alive, rippling and pulsing with colour.

On the other side of the forest is **The Bloom**, a giant, electric, metallic flower, its petals adorned with mirrors that

refract and reflect light. It's so big you can walk right in and pose for a photo at the centre of the flower, where you'll be framed by petals of light.

After your photo, get ready to ride the waves with **He'e nalu**, an ode to surfing that allows even non-surfers to experience the joyous sensation of riding a wave. As you progress through the installation, a wave tunnel appears to open up before you; sometimes the wave rolls towards you, at others, it rolls away.

Which takes us to **Nacre**, a breath-taking natural/non-natural Sea Shell

agglomeration, and creation's most perfect marriage of natural aerodynamic shapes will guide you to Parrot Party, a musical/spatial mystery installation. This cheerful bird flock, inspired by the New Zealand Kea parrot and the Australian rainbow lorikeet, becomes excited when people gather, breaking into song and radiating colourful light. Farewell the party and move to the colourful, turreted facade of Government House Sydney, which TAFE NSW students have transformed with their own brand of brilliance. Finally, explore **Aqueous** an interactive meandering pathway of light

and one of the first pattern based physical sculptures of size and scale that creates a landscape of light.


This is just a taste of the exotic, the beautiful, the intriguing and the downright strange works of light that will lure you through the Garden.

As you meander past the last of the colour, light and movement to find yourself out on Macquarie Street, you may ask yourself, 'What just happened?'

Where: Enter the Garden via the QEII Gates adjacent to the forecourt of the Sydney Opera House.

CUSTOMS HOUSE

Exactly 100 years ago, author May Gibbs gave Australia two characters who dropped out of a gumtree and became instant superstars. Since then, pretty well every Australian child has grown up steeped in the adventures of the intrepid Gumnut Babies, the audacious Snugglepot and the demure Cuddlepie

Generations of Australian children have barracked for their gumnut heroes as they battled the evil Banksia men and their wicked henchmen, the vicious Mrs Snake and the voracious monster Octopus.

Renowned art and animation collective Ample Projects brings May Gibbs' immortal characters to life on the façade of Sydney's 1845 Customs House.

Join Snugglepot and Cuddlepie and their stalwart companions on their journey through the Australian Bush as they encounter the weird, the wonderful - and things quite unknown altogether.

MUSEUM OF CONTEMPORARY ART AUSTRALIA

Virtual Vibration transforms the façade of the Museum of Contemporary Art Australia (MCA) with an evolving image that brings together the cheerful dissonance of psychedelia with the formal concerns of high modernism. This large-scale projection installation is a highly collaborative creative work produced by the Spinifex Group in

conjunction with MCA Collection artist Jonny Niesche and composer Mark Pritchard. It explores the art of Jonny Niesche whose beguiling compositions offer shifting, sensory experiences produced by subtle acts of reflection, transparency and movement. Mark Pritchard's accompanying score adds an epic, monumental sound to this beautiful and mesmerising experience.



HARBOUR LIGHTS

Brilliant LED lighting from 32 Hundred simultaneously change colour as they pass through a spectrum of light environments.

This creates a stunning light show that merges art and technology.



MYSTERY GÂTEAU

Network Ten and MasterChef Australia the façade of the ASN Co. Building in The Rocks to celebrate Vivid Sydney's 10th Birthday. Mini construction-workerchefs will guide you on a journey of fun and wonderment, with the famous MasterChef clock ticking down to the final extraordinary surprise.



CADMANS COTTAGE

BALLpit transforms historic Cadmans Cottage into a virtual space where visitors swim, jump, push, and dance through rooms filled with tens of

thousands of virtual, responsive, toy balls. The massed assembly of coloured balls creates a place of fantasy, impossible to experience in the real world.



SKYLARK

Skylark is a vast play of light stretching from the Sydney Harbour Bridge and the skyscrapers of Circular Quay to the outer reaches of Sydney Harbour.

This year's spectacular display, by lain Reed of 32 Hundred Lighting features Bradfield's Beacon, Australia's most powerful laser. From its position on the Bridge, the beacon sends full-colour beams to iconic sites right around the harbour.

Above Circular Quay are 40 interactive pillars of light controlled from a panel near Pier 8. Every 30 minutes the beacon, skyscrapers, pillars of light and Sydney Harbour Bridge, combine

to create a spectacular two-minute sky show. This luminous web of light can be experienced from multiple vantage points on and around Sydney Harbour.


The iconic face of Luna Park Sydney smiles more brightly and the Ferris Wheel shines as never before at this year's Vivid Sydney.

EATING OUT IN SYDNEY

Sydney dining is renowned for its fresh seafood, global food options and styles, plus heritage pubs, restaurants and cafes with harbour or ocean views.

As Sydney's dining options continue to grow and change, new eat streets and food neighbourhoods are emerging across the city.

The Streets of Barangaroo, part of the huge Barangaroo development on Sydney Harbour, seems to have a new restaurant or bar opening every week. Recent openings include the much-anticipated Barangaroo House (Matt Moran's three-storey harbourside food palace), Japanese eatery Fujisaki, with famed chef Chui Lee Luk behind the burners, and Bing's Bao and Beer, serving Asian-style meats in steamed buns.

South of the city centre, foodies will love The Cannery Rosebery with its cooking school, greengrocers, bakery, butcher,

distillery, kitchenware store, plus restaurants, including Stanton & Co. Banh Xeo Bar, Frenchies Bistro & Brewery, Zeus Street Greek, Three Blue **Ducks** and more in the neighbourhood.

At Chippendale's cool **Kensington Street** precinct, the Asian eateries of Spice Alley and the sophistication of The Old Clare are joined by Holy Duck!, Eastside Kitchen & Bar, Gin Lane, Automata and Kensington Street Social.

The **Tramsheds** complex in Glebe has restaurants and food shops all under one very cool roof, including Butcher and the Farmer, Bekya, Fish & Co, Mama's Buoi, Dust and Bodega 1904

At The Star, you'll love the food at BLACK Bar & Grill, Balla, the phenomenal

Momofuko Seiobo, Sokyo and The **Century**. Surry Hills has added new dining hotspot **Chin Chin** to its long list of restaurants while, near the water, hip Mexican food is served at Fonda in Bondi and **Seventeen** at Walsh Bay combines the best of Australian produce, from the land and the ocean.

In bustling Parramatta, tuck into the fried chicken and champagne at Butter, western Sydney's sister restaurant to the Surry Hills original.

At popular riverside diner Alex & Co, enjoy the butternut risotto, blackened king trout and three-hour braised lamb shoulder, as well as oysters, pizzas and burgers.

Find out about Sydney's local seafood on an insightful tour of the iconic Sydney Fish Market, or wine and dine your way around the restaurants and bars of Sydney Opera House on a Taste of the

Opera House tour. Taste Cultural Food Tours will take you to the places Sydney locals love for dining, in neighbourhoods all over the city; at Barangaroo, **Aboriginal Cultural Tours** helps to uncover Sydney's newest waterfront park while exploring its cultural significance and bush foods.

- The Lord Dudley in Woollahra is an English-style pub with two roaring fires to keep you warm as you play board games and dine on pub classics, washed down with craft beers.
- The Old Fitzroy Hotel in Woolloomooloo has 22 beers on tap and an in-house theatre, as well as free marshmallows to toast over the open fire.
- The Hero of Waterloo in The Rocks offers ghost tours as well as three fireplaces for you to warm your cockles by.
- Camden Valley Inn, an hour's drive from Sydney, has a cosy country-style ambience including a warming fireplace in Winter.
- The Commons Local Eating House in Darlinghurst was a former stable, and the cosy fire and rustic farmhouse menu make it perfect for a Winter snuggle.





FEED THE FAMILY

Affordable family dining, serving food the kids will love, is easy to find in Sydney.

including pizzas, smoothies and mocktails, plus ping-pong and board games.

Former bowling club, **The Greens** in North Sydney is now a casual restaurant and bar, with kid-friendly lawn bowls and, at **The Newport**, on Sydney's northern beaches, an upside-down plane on the ceiling, a giant Scrabble board, ping-pong tables and a basketball hoop will keep the little ones entertained. The **Boathouse at Balmoral** is perfectly positioned next to a beach, playground and netted swimming area. Have

At Coogee Pavilion, there's a kid's menu breakfast with a koala for company at western Sydney's Featherdale Wildlife **Park** and, after an all-day breakfast at the Armory Wharf Cafe, hire bikes and head out along the easy cycle tracks at Sydney Olympic Park. Head to **BL** Burgers in Parramatta, where the kids will love pulled pork, classic cheese, beef or chicken burgers. For dessert, hit **Black** Star Pastry in Newtown and Rosebery, and Cow and the Moon in Enmore for award-winning gelato. At the Interchange in Chatswood, the kids will love The District's market-style Asian food court.

BAR HOPPING

From pubs to rooftop venues and cocktail hideaways, Sydney's bar scene has never been more diverse.

There seems to be a never-ending series of new bar openings in Sydney. The latest include **Alleyway** on George Street, a tiny 26 square-metre bar, selling 75 whiskies; Gin Lane in Chippendale; the Duke of Clarence, modelled on an 18th-century British pub on Clarence Street; speakeasy Door Knock bar on Pitt Street; Rosé **Royale** in Potts Point, which specialises

in rosé wines, and the '70s-influenced Bondi Beach Public Bar on Campbell Parade. Get frothy at the All Hands Brewing House at King Street Wharf, which serves craft beer and comfort food, and enjoy a taste of luxury at the glamorous **Champagne Bar** at the new Sofitel Sydney Darling Harbour

WHAT'S ON IN SYDNEY?

There's always plenty to see and do on a visit to Sydney, before, during and after Vivid Sydney.

The **Sydney Writers' Festival**, 14th Sydney Comedy Festival and Sydney Film Festival are all on during May and June, as is the 21st Biennale of Sydney, when 70 artists show their work in seven museums, galleries and exhibition spaces across the city. The **Sydney Theatre Company** presents George Bernard Shaw's dynamic classic Saint Joan, as part of its 2018 season, while **Belvoir** St Theatre in Surry Hills has The Sugar House, a story of work and corruption, family and massive social change, and the **Ensemble Theatre** in North Sydney presents the hit comedy Shirley Valentine. Listen to Handel's Athalia performed at City Recital Hall, and watch the performance of *Dark Emu* by the incomparable Bangarra Dance Theatre

at the Sydney Opera House. Don't miss the Sydney Dance Company's world premiere of ab [intra] at the Roslyn Packer Theatre Walsh Bay or head to **The Concourse** in Chatswood for a performance of Strictly Ballroom The Musical.

The **Art Gallery of NSW**'s exhibition of The Lady and the Unicorn, a six-tapestry series, is considered a masterpiece of medieval French art, on until 24 June. At the Powerhouse Museum, the focus is on the history of men's fashion with Reigning Men: Fashion in Menswear 1715 -2015. In western Sydney, Campbelltown Arts Centre's exhibition Action and Consequence is collated in collaboration with Aunty Glenda Chalker, a local Dharawal elder.

SYDNEY SHOPPING

Stroll the streets of Sydney during Winter to look for that perfect gift or little something to remind you of your visit.

Sydney has a mix of designer stores, heritage shopping malls, vibrant markets and sleek shopping centres. Visit hundreds of stores in Sydney's palatial Queen Victoria Building, the historic Strand Arcade and the bustling shopping street, Pitt Street Mall, which connects the Mid City Centre and Westfield **Sydney** shopping centres, home to local and international high street and designer brands.

On Paddington's **The Intersection** (corner of Glenmore Road and Oxford St), you'll find Australia's coolest designers in one spot, including Tsubi, Ginger & Smart, Sass & Bide and Zimmermann. Chippendale's **Central Park** has a cool mix of one-offs and streetwear stores, including artisan shoemaker Extraordinary Ordinary Day, plus Adidas, Foot Locker, Glue and Hype.


At Darling Harbour, **The Star** is home to luxury fashion brands Chanel, Gucci, Bottega Veneta and Salvatore Ferragamo,

while in **The Rocks**, the small laneways are full of art, craft and jewellery stores. The Streets of Barangaroo has a David Jones department store and Peter's of Kensington homewares store, while Shirt Bar, The Waiting Room, Collector Store and The Standard Store are among the smaller specialist shops in this harbourside neighbourhood.

Between Westfield Chatswood and Chatswood Chase, there is no shortage of places to shop for fashion, food, homewares and more in this north shore neighbourhood.

For edgier fashion, head to King Street in Newtown or Crown Street in Surry Hills. Don't miss popular weekend markets at Glebe, Bondi, Paddington and **Rozelle** for small fashion and jewellery designers plus art and craft makers, and the Blak Markets, which showcase Aboriginal art, music, food and dance throughout the year at La Perouse and Barangaroo.







WHERE TO STAY


It's been a great year for accommodation in Sydney with the room inventory increasing thanks to the opening of several new luxury hotels.

One of the most anticipated recent Spicers Potts Point is an urban retreat in openings, the Sofitel Sydney Darling a heritage 1880s terrace, with the feel of Harbour has stunning city skyline views, a private club. **Felix Hotel** near Sydney a rooftop pool, the Champagne Bar, and a Airport recalls a time of glamorous travel, French restaurant. At the boutique **West** with a retro-themed interior, and Parramatta's **SKYE Hotel Suites** combine **Hotel Sydney** on Sussex Street, a design tech and luxury in 72 hotel apartments. focal point is the open-air garden atrium.

The equine-themed, five-star William **Inglis Hotel** in Warwick Farm is at the heart of the new Inglis Riverside Stables precinct in Western Sydney and has an outdoor pool with cabanas and bar, while Paddington's **Mrs Banks Boutique** Hotel, is located in a beautifully restored

heritage building on Oxford Street. The newest kid on the block is **Paramount House Hotel**, an uber-cool reimagination of the former headquarters of Paramount Picture Studios on Commonwealth Street in Surry Hills.





GREAT SYDNEY WALKS

Sydney has hundreds of kilometres of scenic walks that take in the coast, the harbour, national parks and important cultural heritage sites.

Grab a water bottle, a hat and a pair of good walking shoes and explore the city on foot. The Bondi to Coogee Coastal Walk is an iconic 6km path along the coast, taking in surf beaches, cafes, and amazing views, while the **Hermitage** Foreshore Walk is an easy 1.8km track around the harbour bays of Vaucluse.

The Spit Bridge to Manly is a 10km walk around north shore bays and beaches, and through the bushland of Sydney Harbour National Park. The walk from Bradleys Head to Chowder Bay is a 4km gentle bush track with lovely harbour views and wildlife, ending at a sheltered beach. In Western Sydney Parklands there are multiple walking loops and paths plus the Treetops Adventure course for kids aged three and older. To the north of the city, the Aboriginal Heritage Walk is a self-guided trail that takes in rock art and engravings of the Guringai people in Ku-ring-gai Chase National Park. Sydney's northern beaches are also home to the Barrenjoey Lighthouse Track, a lovely walk from the base of the Barrenjoey Headland to the heritage lighthouse, which offers great views over Pittwater, Lion Island and the ocean.

South of the city, the Henry Head Walking **Track** overlooks Botany Bay, passes through Kamay Botany Bay National Park and is great for whale watching from May to November. The **Bundeena to Marley** Walk is a stunning 8km loop in the Royal National Park, which combines bush, beaches and ocean views. Kadoo Tours organises one-day Aboriginal walks at Watsons Bay and La Perouse.



HIT THE HARBOUR

Find a new way to explore the city's natural wonder.

The small islands that dot Sydney Harbour are among the city's best-kept secrets, and are ideal for walks, picnics, dining and camping. Most of the harbour islands are easy to get to by ferry or on a harbour cruise, such as one with Tribal Warrior Harbour Cruises which visits Clark Island. UNESCO World Heritagelisted **Cockatoo Island** is one of Australia's convict sites and has a fascinating historic trail around its convict buildings and shipyards, a great cafe with fantastic views of the Sydney Harbour Bridge, pitched tents and camp sites. **Goat Island** has a heritage tour of its convict quarry and Queen's Magazine – used to store

huge quantities of gunpowder - while Shark Island has a sheltered picnic area, small beach and barbecues for a great day out. Catch a ferry to **Fort Denison**. home to the world's most complete Martello tower, for daily tours.

Explore the harbour by **kayak** on a sunrise tour with Sydney By Kayak, join a harbour cruise - try the Wine and Chocolate Sunset Cruise on Fantasea's newest vessel Joy Bar - experience the thrill of a high-speed jet boat ride or board a yacht for a peaceful day of sailing. Sydney's ferries criss-cross the harbour, and offer outstanding views along the way, with new services to and from Barangaroo.

REACH NEW HEIGHTS

The view of Sydney from above is like no other.

See the city from a new angle when you summit the world-famous Sydney Harbour Bridge with **BridgeClimb**. There is a choice of walks, including two conducted in Mandarin. And you can't visit Sydney without taking in the view from the top of Sydney Tower – the tallest building in the city.

At iFly Indoor Skydiving in Penrith, you can master the skills of skydiving in a giant glass tunnel, or experience a bird's eye view of life at Trees Adventure in Yarramundi near Richmond by travelling through the treetops on a series of flying foxes, tight ropes and tunnels.

some of Australia's surfing legends. The Boardwalk is the place to go for sophisticated dining and upmarket bars with water views. In the heritage suburb of Cooks Hill, Darby Street has a mix of cafes, galleries and fashion. With a great choice of bay and ocean beaches, a resident population of playful dolphins and easy access to Myall Lakes National Park, **Port Stephens** is an aquatic wonderland. Whale watching is a seasonal highlight from May to November each year while **Stockton Beach** is the site of awesome quad bike safaris.

Known for its many natural attractions beautiful beaches, national parks and hinterland - the **Central Coast** is packed with outdoor adventures. Everything from hiking and horse riding to mountain biking and microlight adventures will leave you refreshed and rejuvenated.

Enjoy a different taste of country life in **Bathurst**, the vibrant city that is Australia's oldest inland European settlement. Explore this virtual open-air museum on a heritage walk, before heading to the famous Mount Panorama Motor Racing Circuit, officially opened as a scenic drive in 1938 and now worldrenowned amongst fans of motor racing.



LORD HOWE ISLAND

One of Australia's best-kept secrets, this scenic island's beauty far outstrips its modest dimensions.

Walk beneath shady banyan trees and along pristine, white-sand beaches; explore the world's most southerly coral reefs and giant rock pools, each a window on a world of colourful marine life.

The island is a biological ark and a perch for exotic species of seabirds on migratory journeys. Due to its stunning natural phenomena and abundance of rare plants and animals, the entire island is World Heritage listed. It's an exotic

destination to enjoy cycling, hiking, birdwatching, snorkelling, diving and chilling out.

Lord Howe Island is less than two hours' flight from Sydney; QantasLink flies to the island from Sydney several times a week and from Brisbane on weekends. A seasonal weekly service operates from Port Macquarie from February to June and between September and December.



TAKE THE COAST ROAD

Starting from the Royal National Park on Sydney's southern edge, the Grand Pacific Drive is a sensational 140km coastal route.

Explore the **Royal National Park**, where you'll discover rainforests, creeks, sea-sculpted sandstone headlands plus wild stretches of coastal heath. Further south, stop at Bald Hill Lookout for an amazing panorama along the coast, before heading down to **Stanwell Park** beach for a walk or swim. The scenic climax of the drive is the 665-metre-long Sea Cliff Bridge, an engineering marvel that swerves out from the cliffs above the pounding ocean. Take a stroll around Wollongong Harbour, the horseshoe-

shaped scoop also known as Belmore Basin, and try some of the city's dining options. Hike along the boardwalk at Minnamurra Rainforest, where giant roots creep across the forest floor in the shadow of the Great Dividing Range; stop for fish and chips at **Kiama** and marvel at the famous blowhole.

The drive ends near **Nowra**, where you can choose to either head back to Sydney or turn inland to **Kangaroo Valley** and the Southern Highlands, where you can enjoy fine food and wine.

LEGENDARY PACIFIC COAST DRIVE

This self-drive touring route between Sydney and Brisbane uncovers the many treasures of the NSW coast and hinterland, with adventure and inspiration around every corner.

At just over 900 kilometres long, the drive takes in vineyards and tropical fruit farms, palm forests and lush countryside, important Aboriginal cultural heritage sites, colonial-era attractions and World Heritage rainforests alive with the sounds of whip birds and tumbling waterfalls.

You'll discover stunning beaches and coastal villages, where seafood arrives fresh from the back of the local fishing boats. You'll also share in the well-tuned appreciation for the finer things in life, from luxury resorts and a celebrated dining scene to the beautiful wines of the Hunter Valley, spa retreats and coastal getaways with championship golf courses. Don't miss pretty **Bellingen**, gateway to the rainforests and waterfalls of Dorrigo National Park, and myriad adventure sports along the **Coffs Coast**. Take the detour to Byron Bay, the cool and hip New Age hub of the North Coast, driving through lush pastures and macadamia plantations to **Bangalow**, a sleepy country town with standout dining and shopping. Further north, **Kingscliff** is known for its great beaches and surf breaks, cafes and restaurants along Marine Parade and Bells Boulevard.

Themed itineraries include everything from food and wine to whale- and dolphin-watching cruises, surfing,

national parks and more. Just pick an experience and create your own self-drive adventure in this beautiful part of the world.

The North Coast is well serviced by airports, providing plenty of options for starting or finishing your trip; fly/drive packages are another option. As well as airports in Sydney and the Gold Coast, other locations include Newcastle, Port Macquarie, Coffs Harbour, Ballina/Byron and **Lismore**. Alternatively, hire a campervan and do the drive from the luxury of your home-on-the-road; and don't forget to pack your bike – there are around 800 kilometres of scenic back roads that branch out from the main drive.

WATERFALLS AND RAINFORESTS

Explore a world of stunning natural attractions on two short but very scenic trails on the North Coast.

The 185km drive from the **Coffs Coast** into the Great Dividing Range is a beautiful tourist drive known as the Waterfall Way. There are magnificent waterfalls, rugged gorges and World Heritage Gondwana rainforest, while lookouts and walking trails allow plenty of access points. Two grandiose waterfalls tumble into the valley at **Ebor** Falls and Wollomombi Gorge, which is claimed as one of the State's highest drops. Views from Point Lookout, across the misty blue ranges of the **New England** National Park, are pure inspiration.

The Gondwana Rainforests of Australia are a World Heritage jewel, home to the most extensive areas of subtropical

rainforest in the world. A series of meandering drives criss-crosses Northern NSW along the Rainforest Way for hundreds of kilometres, taking you on a journey into an awe-inspiring landscape.

Get up close to the habitat of the rare Antarctic beech rainforest, watch waterfalls dropping into deep palmshaded gorges, walk along misty boardwalks under the treetops and marvel at the panoramic vistas. Access this stunning region from **Kyogle**, known as the Gateway to the Rainforest, or from Murwillumbah, where the World Heritage Rainforest Information Centre is well worth a visit.

SYDNEY MELBOURNE COASTAL DRIVE

Stretching from Stanwell Park, south along the NSW coast as far as Eden, the South Coast is known for its unspoilt natural beauty and more than 35 national parks, marine parks and reserves.

Crystal-clear bays and lakes, uncrowded beaches and beautiful rivers are perfect year-round for fishing, surfing, diving, canoeing and boating, while bushwalkers, birdwatchers and cyclists will love the pristine bushland. This route also takes in the **Shoalhaven Coast**, one of the 14 designated wine regions in NSW.

The Sydney Melbourne Coastal Drive is an eclectic mix of touring experiences that are ideally suited to a leisurely drive. Starting from either Sydney or Melbourne, it's a 1,300km trip with plenty of highlights along the way. Don't miss the awesome blowhole at **Kiama**, spot dolphins or whales on a cruise from Jervis Bay or **Eden**, meet the resident eastern grey kangaroos at **Pebbly Beach** and visit the seal and little penguin colonies at Montague Island near Narooma.

You'll never be far from a winery, the seafood is sensational and the region's chefs are creative and talented. You'll love the rustic delights of **Berry**, a historic village with a sourdough baker and great shopping, book ahead for a table at Rick Stein's award-winning seafood restaurant, Bannisters at Mollymook, or stop at any number of small eateries serving fresh local produce. The pristine waterways

of the region are home to a large chunk of Australia's Oyster Coast with the Sydney Rock Oyster the local speciality. Find a spot by a river and enjoy a picnic of freshlyshucked oysters paired with a glass of Shoalhaven wine.

This drive connects with the Grand Pacific Drive, just north of **Wollongong**. It's a spectacular end, or beginning, to an iconic Australian road trip.



THE LONG PADDOCK

Winter is the best season for a holiday in Outback NSW. where cool nights, warm, sunny days and wide-open spaces make touring by car a real pleasure.

A stock route still in use today, **the Long Paddock** touring route follows the Cobb Highway (610km) from Echuca Moama, on the Murray River, through to Deniliquin, Hay, Menindee Lakes and Wilcannia. Heritage-themed sculptures line the route and tourist signposts tell the stories of these remote outback communities. It's a fascinating journey, passing through striking landscapes including the **Hay Plains**,renowned as the flattest place in the southern hemisphere. It's also an easy drive, accessible by caravan, car or 4WD.



DARLING RIVER RUN

Explore more of Outback NSW on this 730km route from **Walgett** to **Wentworth**. To enjoy the experience and see all the sights, take your time and set aside at least five days of touring.

As well as the **Darling River**, this route takes in some of the State's iconic inland rivers and some of its most remote and historic towns, Bourke, Louth, Tilpa, Wilcannia, Menindee, Pooncarie. The ancient rock formations and Aboriginal cultural sites in World Heritage-listed Mungo National Park are fascinating, as are rock carvings along Mulgowan (Yappa) Art Site walk in **Gundabooka National Park**, and the pastoral heritage of Kinchega Woolshed in **Kinchega National Park**.



THE FOSSICKERS WAY

In the **New England** area, fossicking and the possibility of gem finds offer irresistible opportunities for adventure. Head out to one of the fossicking reserves along the **Fossickers Way** to try your luck. This looped drive begins at **Nundle**, and passes through **Tamworth**, Manilla, Barraba, Bingara, Warialda, Inverell, Glen **Innes** and on to **Emmaville**, where it rejoins the New England Highway. Glen Innes is renowned for some of the richest gem and mineral fields in the country, making it a great place to start your fossicking adventure. Further west, Inverell is known as Sapphire City, after sapphire finds in 1854; try your hand at fossicking for sapphires, other gems and quartz crystals. Pick up a map of the drive from a local visitor information centre.







WORLD HERITAGE TRAILS IN THE BLUE MOUNTAINS

The Greater Blue Mountains Drive is more than 1,200 kilometres long, with 18 Discovery Trails making it easier to explore its treasure trove of natural attractions and inspiring experiences.

One of the State's finest touring routes, this giant figure of eight looped drive has themed Discovery Trails branching off, so you can customise an itinerary to suit your interests and time frame. Bushwalks, mountain-bike trails, historic villages, botanical wonders and bush-lined creeks, that still bear specks of gold, are just some of the adventures waiting for you. The common link is the network of

national parks and conservation areas that make up the **Greater Blue Mountains** World Heritage Area stretching from the Upper Hunter to Mudgee, Goulburn, the Southern Highlands and the Hawkesbury. Access from Sydney is easy via the Hawkesbury Valley, from Glenbrook in the Blue Mountains or the **Australian** Botanic Garden Mount Annan. Some trails lead to the region's well-known sights.

including Echo Point, Wentworth Falls and the **Jenolan Caves**; some to more remote locations that are bound to surprise. The 63km **Yerranderie** trail, for example, is an adventurous drive to an historic mining village; the 44km Newnes Plateau trail leads to Wollemi National Park and the Glow Worm Tunnel, and the 113km Capertee Valley drive is a scenic route through the world's second-largest canyon.


TOURING THE SNOWY VALLEYS AND BEYOND

A series of drives that interconnect make driving here a real pleasure all year-round. The Snowy Valleys Way picks up the alpine trail on the western side of **Kosciuszko** National Park at Tumbarumba and heads towards **Batlow** and **Tumut**. Highlights along the way include the spectacular

Autumn colours, beautiful valleys, cool-climate vineyards around Tumbarumba, and farm gates selling fresh seasonal produce. The final leg of this drive leads to **Gundagai**, home of the famous Dog on the Tuckerbox statue. The Snowy Mountains Highway is another part

NSW FOOD AND WINE TRAILS

There are more delicious food and wine experiences than you could poke a fork at across NSW. Here's just a taste of what awaits the adventurous foodie.

The **Southern Highlands**, renowned for its parks and gardens and historic villages, is also home to a host of food and wine experiences. Put local produce to the test at award-winning restaurants such as Biota in **Bowral** and Eschalot in **Berrima**. Buy just-picked berries from Cuttaway Creek's farm gate in season, taste cider and mead at Artemis Wines and single malt whisky at Joadja Whisky.

All the essential ingredients for a relaxing weekend away can be found in the small towns, cool-climate vineyards, eateries and cosy B&Bs in the Yass Valley. There's plenty to take in, from Kurt Neumann's acclaimed restaurant, Grazing, in the 150-year-old Royal Hotel in **Gundaroo**, to the country smokehouse cafe, Poachers Pantry, near **Hall**. Many of the region's 30 cellar doors are found around Murrumbateman and Bungendore.

Central NSW is one of the State's prized agricultural regions, known for its wide range of quality produce. It's also home to three designated wine regions around Orange, Mudgee and Cowra, beautiful regional restaurants and cellar doors, cafes, pubs, farmers markets and boutique breweries.

Taste fresh goat cheese from Jannei Goat Dairy, just outside **Lithgow**, and then eat your way west! Dining here is delicious – don't miss The Zin House and Pipeclay Pumphouse in **Mudgee**. Lolli Redini and Racine in **Orange** and Tonic in Millthorpe.

The Murray, named for the mighty river that flows through the region, is known as one of Australia's most important agricultural regions, attracting foodies, wine lovers, golfers and water-sport The Murray River food and wine trail

begins in **Deniliquin**, one of the gateway towns to this meandering driving route that allows you to travel at your own pace. Next stop is **Echuca-Moama**, known for its paddle-steamers and the nearby cellar doors of the small Perricoota wine region. Further along the river is Tocumwal, home of the big Murray cod, the golfers' paradise of Mulwala, and Corowa, birthplace of Australian Federation and a popular swimming and fishing spot. The drive ends at **Albury**, the cultural hub of the region.

Known as the food bowl of Australia, the Riverina is a foodie's dream destination with exciting food festivals, a wide range of fresh produce and great wine. Just beyond is the beautiful **Snowy Mountains** region and more delicious food adventures. The Riverina to Snowy Valleys Way drive

starts in multicultural **Griffith**, known for its Italian heritage, world-class wineries and gourmet produce. From here, it meanders through **Leeton**, known for its art-deco architecture, and on to Narrandera and Wagga Wagga, the hub of this dynamic food and wine region.

Take a side trip for sweet treats at **Junee** Licorice and Chocolate Factory and cheese and wine tastings at Coolamon Cheese. Heading west, the trip ends at **Tumbarumba**, home to a cool-climate wine region in the foothills of the Snowy Mountains.
