Swan Bells Belltower (O20)

Point Fraser Wetlands (N35)
Eastern end of city foreshore. City of Perth 9461 3333
A major wetland redevelopment including boardwalks, wetland planting and local Aboriginal interpretation.

Parliament House (L10)
Harvest Terrace, West Perth 9222 7259
Public tours are conducted every Monday and Thursday at 10.30am.

Perth Town Hall (K21)
Cnr Barrack & Hay Streets, Perth 9461 3333
One of the oldest convict built buildings in the city.

Stirling Gardens (L21)
Cnr Barrack Street & St Georges Terrace, Perth
The earliest garden in Perth and home to some of the city's most popular street art the Gumnut Babies and Kangaroos.

Supreme Court Gardens (N21)
Cnr Barrack Street & Riverside Drive, Perth
Opened in 1845 as a botanical garden and venue, during the summer months, to a series of events such as Opera in the Park and Carols By Candlelight.
