

Magome Bunshi Mura

In Magome, a number of novelists and artists such as Kawabata Yasunari, Uno Chiyo, Kitahara Hakushu and so forth lived in the late Taisho era and the early Showa era. The city has set up a "walking course" around Magome and Sannoh for visiting the memorial places of writers and artists.








Shinagawa

The Soto School temple was built by Tokugawa Ieyasu in 1612. It is known as the burial ground of the FortySeven Loyal Retainers. There are a bronze statue of Oishi Kuranosuke and graves of the loyal retainers.







Zojoji Temple

Founded in 1393 as a fundamental nembutsu seminary of the Jodoshu School in east Japan, Zojoji later became the family temple of the Tokugawa shogunate. The wooden gate of the temple remains as the original architectural remainder of the early 17th century and is designated as an important cultural property of Japan.























Ginza




Chichi jima
